More and more people are using oxygen therapy in their homes to maintain active and productive lives. The purpose of the PM15F or PM15P is to supply breathable, compressed air for respiratory care.

# Do's & Don'ts ... Tips on how to use your compressor safely ...

- **Do** be sure the compressor is grounded. This product is equipped with a cord having a grounding wire with a grounding plug.
- Don't use while bathing.
- Don't place or store where it can fall or be pulled into a tub or sink.
- Don't place or drop into water, other liquid or any opening or hole.
- Don't reach for a product that has fallen into water. Unplug immediately.
- Don't attempt to repair product. Any attempt could result in electrical shock.
- Don't use near any type of flame or flammable/explosive substances.
- **Do** be cautious when using this product where oxygen is being administered.
- Don't allow product to exceed Operating or Storage Temperature specs.
- Don't leave the product unattended when product is running.
- Do use close supervision when this product is used by, on, or near children or invalids.
- Don't use while sleepy or drowsy.
- Do keep cord away from heated surfaces.
- Do use product only for its "intended use".
- Don't use attachments not recommended by the manufacturer.
- **Don't** use product with any equipment that requires "dry" air, including ventilators, gas blenders, or flow generators, without a device to properly dehumidify the discharged air of the PM 15.
- Don't use this product if:
  - o It has a damaged cord or plug
  - o It is not working properly
  - o It has been dropped or damaged
  - o It has been dropped into water

# **OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS ...**

BEFORE STARTING UNIT — PULL OUT REGULATOR KNOB TO UNLOCK, THEN TURN KNOB FULLY COUNTERCLOCKWISE.

- 1. Become familiar with the product. Inspect product for damage. DO NOT use if any damage is found.
- 2. Position product near a properly grounded electrical receptacle. Allow a minimum of 4" clearance on all sides to ensure adequate air flow for cooling of product.
- 3. Be sure the on/off (I/O) switch is in the Off (O) position.
- 4. Be sure the Power Cord is properly connected.
- 5. Attach appropriate device to the Outlet Fitting, securely, without overtightening.
- 6. Pull Regulator Knob OUT to unlock regulator, then turn Knob fully counterclockwise.
- 7. Press the On/Off (I/O) Switch to the On (I) position.
- 8. Adjust pressure/flow.
  - To INCREASE pressure/flow Turn Knob CLOCKWISE
  - To DECREASE pressure/flow Turn Knob COUNTERCLOCKWISE

- 9. Push Regulator Knob IN to lock pressure/flow setting.
- 10. Compressor is now ready to use.
- 11. When the compressor is not in use, press the On/Off (I/O) Switch to the OFF (O) position.

# **CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE...**

# WEEKLY:

- You should check both air filters on top rear of cabinet for dust buildup.
- If dust buildup occurs, unplug product, remove air filters from their recessed areas and wash in warm, soapy water and rinse.
- Absorb excess water from filters with a dry towel.
- Return filters to their original locations.

# Caution:

- Excessive dust buildup will reduce performance of product. If this occurs, clean or replace with new filters.
- o The air filter on top of the compressor does not filter out saline. Treatments using nebulized saline will draw the saline mist back into the product. Saline causes rapid deterioration of the compressor seals and will void the warranty.

# AS NEEDED:

- Clean exterior surfaces with a cloth or sponge dampened with soap and water.
- Wipe dry with a clean cloth or paper towel.
- If product is used for treatment of infectious disease, consult your physician or healthcare professional for recommended cleaning procedures.

## REMEMBER TO CONTACT DASCO IF ...

- Your compressor malfunctions. It is important to call as soon as possible.
- You are unable to keep a scheduled appointment.
- · Your physician changes your prescription.
- You relocate.

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You have a change in insurance or physician.

# INFECTION CONTROL: What are everyday preventive actions?

Everyday preventive actions are steps that people can take to help slow the spread of germs that cause respiratory illness, like flu. These include the following personal and community actions:

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue, when you cough or sneeze. This will block the spread of droplets from your mouth or nose that could contain germs.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand rub.
  - Scrub hands with soap or sanitizer thoroughly for 30 seconds.
  - Rinse thoroughly when using soap and dry with a clean paper towel
  - Turn faucet off with paper towel
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth. Germs spread this way.
- Try to avoid close contact with sick people
- If you or your child gets sick with a respiratory illness, like flu, limit contact with others as much as possible to help prevent spreading illness. Stay home (or keep your child home) for at least 24 hours after fever is gone except to seek medical care or for other necessities. Fever should be gone without the use of a fever-reducing medicine.
  - If an outbreak of flu or another illness occurs, follow public health advice. This may include information about how to increase distance between people and other measures.

## CAPPED RENTAL ITEMS:

Dasco or supplier does accept and follow all capped rental guidelines.
